## Letter from Archbishop Vigneron Regarding the Ad limina Visit

*Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:*

Soon, along with the other bishops of Michigan and Ohio, I will be on my way for our “Ad limina” Visit – the pilgrimage to Rome required of all diocesan bishops at least every five years. The official days for our visit are 1-6 February. This trip, while it has several distinct components, is basically a pilgrimage to strengthen the bonds of our unity with our Holy Father the Pope.

Let me make a brief remark about each of the components and then go on to reflect with you on the meaning of this pilgrimage, because the significance of its meaning is the reason I am writing this letter.

The visit has three principal elements. First, we bishops go to pray at the tombs of the Apostles Peter and Paul; in fact, we will offer there the Holy Eucharist, the sacrifice by which Christ established and maintains the communion that binds us together in his Mystical Body. Second, we will meet with heads of Vatican offices – what are often thought of as the “cabinet departments” which assist Pope Benedict in his governance of the Church universal – in order to discuss matters of mutual concern for advancing the good of the People of God. And third, we will have an audience with the Holy Father to hear what is on his mind and in his heart as our Chief Shepherd – Peter-for-us-today.

As I mentioned above, the whole point of this pilgrimage is to reaffirm and strengthen our communion with the Pope, the Bishop of Rome. And this communion concerns not just me as a bishop, but you as members of the local Church entrusted to my care. Your communion in life and faith with your bishop, and my communion with the Pope mean that you and I share the same life of grace as does Pope Benedict. That’s important because he is the successor of St. Peter as Christ’s Vicar. To be in union with Pope Benedict is to be in union with Peter. To be in this communion is our guarantee that what you and I believe is what Peter and Paul and the other Apostles knew

and confessed about Jesus. Our communion with the Bishop of Rome, the leader of the local Church where St. Peter and St. Paul were martyred for the faith, is a sort of “seal of authentication” that we belong to the one same community – that the Apostles are truly our fathers, and through our fellowship with them we have full fellowship with the Lord Jesus who appointed them his ambassadors.

On the website of the Archdiocese I have more to share with you about my pilgrimage, but for now I want to affirm that in going to Rome as the pastor of our community, I bring all of you with me in spirit. I will assure the Holy Father of your deep love and loyalty. I ask that you accompany me with your thoughts and prayers – especially your prayers: prayers for His Holiness, prayers for his clergy and people in his Diocese of Rome, prayers for the Archdiocese of Detroit, prayers for the whole Catholic Church throughout the world.

## Family Bible Study

Mark describes what some believe was likely to have been a typical day in Jesus' ministry. Jesus and the disciples that chose to follow him arrive at Capernaum, a small village on the Sea of Galilee. Jesus teaches in the synagogue on the Sabbath. Mark reports that the people respond to Jesus' teaching with astonishment, noting Jesus' authority and contrasting it with the scribes'.

After Jesus' preaching, an even more astonishing thing happens. A man possessed with an unclean spirit calls out to Jesus. The spirits and demons seem to know Jesus and are often fearful of him. In fact, they seem to understand Jesus' identity better than his disciples do. As we will read again and again, Jesus orders the spirit to be quiet and drives the unclean spirit out of the man. Jesus' ability to heal those possessed by demons is an indication of his power over evil.

The people who heard Jesus teach and saw him heal in today's Gospel were said to have been astonished and amazed by the authority of his teaching. So compelling were Jesus' words and actions that the news about him could not be contained; it spread quickly throughout all of Galilee. Two thousand years later, the news about Jesus continues to spread. We are called to participate in sharing the Good News of Jesus with others in our words and in our deeds.

With your family try to name some amazing things, events, or people that you've heard about or witnessed. What did the people who saw and heard Jesus find so amazing? *In Jesus, the people heard and saw the power and authority of God at work.* People should see in our lives the power and authority of God at work. Can you name any modern examples of people in whom you have seen the power and authority of God at work? Pray together that we will experience wonder at the work of God in our world today.

## Worship

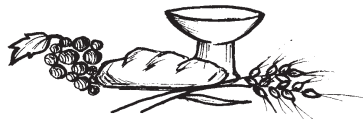


Today's readings point to Jesus as the one who speaks with divine authority, the true prophetic voice promised by God.

The First Reading comes from the book of Deuteronomy in which Moses expounds upon the Law given by God to Israel at Horeb. He is discussing the role that judges, kings, priests, and prophets will have in the life of Israel. Today we hear about Israel's prophets—the promise that God will send a prophet as great as Moses himself, as well as the warning to Israel to differentiate between true and false prophetic voices in their midst.

In the Gospel reading we hear how the people of Capernaum were astonished by Jesus' teachings and were amazed at his miraculous activities. Because of this, Jesus' fame spread throughout the whole region of Galilee. Very likely, Jews were wondering if Jesus of Nazareth might indeed be the prophet that God would "raise up" among their own kin in the tradition of Israel's greatest prophet, Moses.

In the Second Reading from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, we hear some practical advice that Paul offers the Corinthians. Paul's main concern is that the Corinthian Christians "be free of anxieties." Married or single, our lives can be consumed, at times, with anxiety. The practical advice that Paul offers is as valid today as it was nearly two thousand years ago: married or single, too much anxiety—whatever the root cause—can be a major distraction in our relationship with the Lord. It is in our relationship with Christ that we find true and lasting freedom from our anxieties. (Excerpts taken from *At Home with the Word*.)

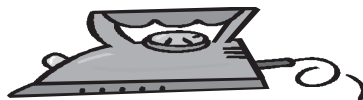

## Christian Service

*Some* people are natural spellbinders. They grab our attention and we want to hear more. We are always in need of understanding others, ourselves and our world. We want to know more and we long to be fulfilled and made whole. We want to be healed of all of our worries, our suffering and pain, and yes, all of our doubt and confusion. We long to put things together and find happiness and wholeness: which when you think about it, it is another word for holiness.

In the synagogue that day, Jesus held the people spellbound and spoke with an authority of God's will without threatening the people, offering life and hope rather than death and horror.

Jesus had power, he tells a demon to come out of a man—and it does! He orders Lazarus to rise from the dead—and Lazarus lives! He takes enough food for a few, prays over it, and suddenly there is enough to feed thousands!

In Scripture, Jesus' powerful miracles inspire faith and overwhelm people with spiritual excitement, so it's no wonder the crowds run and tell their neighbors. Witnesses to miracles can tell stories to their family, friends, and strangers and keep them spellbound, holding their attention, and the result may even bring them to see Jesus and hear his message.

Jesus is powerful! And guess what—he gives the power to you and me.

With this power we can change things that are wrong and make them right, and to help insecure people to be fed. With this power we change the world and make it look like the world that God wants it to look like.

We must be sure to not abuse the power given to us by God. Should we use that power to follow the cycle of our need for things; hidden attitudes of buy, spend, invest and then work for more so that we can buy, spend and invest even more? Should we use that power to climb the ladder of social and business success to the detriment of the poor, the suffering and those less fortunate? We can be so caught up in this vicious cycle that we are driven by our own wants than our needs. Maybe that is the reason for feeling unfulfilled in our lives.

We must follow Jesus' teaching and know that our God is truly interested in eliminating all suffering. That is the point of the story about the man with the unclean spirit. Jesus not only preached

the good news; he also lived that good news by healing the poor afflicted man.

We should be a people of love, of healing and preachers, holding others spellbound with our stories of the good news as we try with all of our hearts to live it each and every day.

A sure sign in any relationship is communication—the initiative to open one's mind and heart to another.

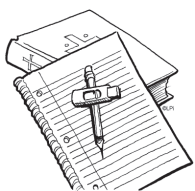
This is an intriguing story of twins, Marion and Shiva Stone, born in Ethiopia and their journey through life.
