### Collection Next Weekend for the Pallottine Missions

Fr. Noel O'Connor, SAC, an Irish Pallottine priest, will visit the parish next weekend October 22/23 and share a few thoughts about the Pallottine Missions in East Africa.

Born in County Tipperary, Ireland, he was ordained on June 10, 1978. That same year, he left Ireland for London. In 1983, he went to Tanzania and worked there for the last 28 years. In 2011, he was sent to this country to raise funds for the Missions in East Africa. Fr. Noel has first hand experience as a missionary in one of the poorest countries of the world.

For the past 70 years, with the generosity forthcoming from the people of the USA, the Pallottines helped found 2 Dioceses, built 2 Cathedrals, 80 Churches, Day Care Centers for children, 100 Primary Schools, 20 Secondary Schools, 3 Vocational Colleges and many Community Centers. Your generosity has helped to educate many, many children. The Pallottines have also established hospitals, dispensaries and many centers for the care of the elderly, the handicapped and those suffering with AIDS.

Your concern, prayers and financial support are appreciated. *We give by going on the missions, you go on the missions by giving.* We would like you to see this as an opportunity to build up the Body of Christ which is the Universal Church. May God reward you as He will for your generosity.

## Family Bible Study

Today, the Pharisees send their disciples to test Jesus



with a question about taxes.

Matthew sets up an unusual partnership between the Pharisees and the Herodians. The Herodians were supporters of Herod Antipas, a Jewish political leader who collaborated with the Romans. Such collaboration would have required a compromised observance of the Mosaic Law. The Pharisees, on the other hand, taught scrupulous observance of the Mosaic Law and opposed Roman occupation. Herodians favored the payment of taxes; the Pharisees opposed it. The Herodians and the Pharisees approach Jesus, asking that he take sides in their dispute. If Jesus answers with the Pharisees, he shows himself to be an enemy of Rome. If he answers with the Herodians, he offends popular Jewish religious sensibilities.

He asks to see a Roman coin, which is readily provided to him. He asks that his questioners examine the coin. Agreeing that it is Caesar's image on the coin, Jesus tells them that it must belong to Caesar. Jesus answers their question with simple logic. Then, going further still, Jesus tells them that their obligation is to pay to God that which belongs to God.

Payment of taxes is unlikely to be a disputed issue in your family. Yet families can still learn something from this Gospel reading.

Make a list of the activities that your family spends time doing together, such as household tasks, jobs, academics, and recreational activities. Talk about the importance of each of these activities. What would happen if there were an imbalance in our attention to these activities and we spent too much time on one activity at the expense of another?

The Herodians and Pharisees were giving too much importance to the issue of the payment of taxes. Jesus reminds them that loving and honoring God is of greater importance. In family life we do many important things, but we remember that God is of the greatest importance in our lives.

Jesus' enemies were trying to trap him into saying something that would get him into trouble. On this occasion, two groups who were enemies of each other got together against him. The Herodians were pro-Roman who advocated paying the Roman tax. The Pharisees were against paying the tax for a couple of reasons. First, the tax was new, so the economic sting in paying taxes was a new one, but more than that, the tax represented Roman dominion. In addition, having coins with the emperor's image and inscriptions of divine status could be interpreted as a form of idolatry. Therefore, this was probably already an ongoing argument between the two groups. Now they want Jesus to take sides, hoping that whatever he says will make him lose credulity.

"Is it lawful..." means "according to Jewish law." If Jesus said yes, they could accuse him of idolatry. But if he said no, they could accuse him of being against Rome. They were trying to trap Jesus into pitting Jewish law against Roman law. But as Jesus often did, he answered their question with another question: Whose image is on it? If it's the emperor's, it belongs to him, so give it back to him. But don't forget to give to God what belongs to God. And what has the stamp of God's image? We do, since we are made in the image of God. How do we Christians give ourselves to God? We come to the table of the Eucharist, where we can give ourselves to God in worship and thanksgiving. **Nicene Creed**

**I believe** in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all **things visible and invisible**. **I believe** in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only **Begotten** Son of God, **born** of the Father **before all ages**. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, **consubstantial** with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, **and by** the Holy Spirit **was incarnate** of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, **he suffered death** and was buried, **and rose again on the third day** in accordance with the Scriptures. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. **I believe** in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, **who** with the Father and the Son **is adored** and glorified, **who** has spoken through the prophets. **I believe** in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. **I confess** one baptism for the forgiveness of sins **and I look forward** to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

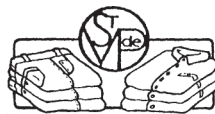
### O.C.E.F.

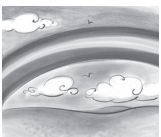
