Family Bible Study

In today's Gospel, Jesus warns against following the example of the scribes and the Pharisees and teaches that those who would be great must be servants. Jesus tells the crowd that it is correct to do and observe what the scribes and Pharisees teach; *it is their example that is to be avoided, namely, their love of being honored and exalted.*

The warning Jesus gives against seeking places of honor in the community was directed as much toward the Christian community as the named Jewish leaders. Indeed, it is a warning that resonates with us today. Christian leadership is a call to service for the glory of God; those who would be leaders among us must, like Jesus, be servants of all.

"Do as I say, not as I do." How many of us have been tempted to say this to our children? In today's Gospel we hear a resounding reply from Jesus, "Practice what you preach." Those who know us best, our family and especially our children, can identify the inconsistencies between what we want to teach and the example that we give. The challenge for all of us, especially for those of us who are parents, is to model with consistency the faith and the Christian way of life we wish to teach our children.

Talk about what it means to practice what you preach. Identify some examples of people you know who practice what they preach. What do you observe about these people? What do you admire about them? What are some ways in which your family might better practice the faith that you profess. Choose one action to take that will show your faith in action. Pray that your family's faith will be shown consistently in your actions.

ALL SAINTS DAY

Every year the Church recalls the example, witness, and prayer of the holy women and men who have been identified by the Church as Saints. These saints are more than just role models; they are family members with whom we continue to share relation, in a bond of prayer, called the Communion of Saints. Every year when we celebrate this day, the Gospel we proclaim recalls for us Jesus' teaching about happiness, the Beatitudes.

The Beatitudes can be understood as a framework for Christian living. Because of this, it is natural that we proclaim this Gospel on the Feast of All Saints. Saints are people who lived the spirit of the Beatitudes as Jesus lived. On this day, we too are challenged to model our lives on the spirit and promises of the Beatitudes.

ALL SOULS DAY

On the Feast of All Souls, we pray for the souls of all those who have died. Martha professes her faith in the resurrection, acknowledging that Jesus is Christ, the Son of God. This is the profession of faith we continue to make, and it is the promise on which we base our hope for eternal life for ourselves and for all those who have died.

All our lives we grapple with being a humble servant. Gradually on our life journey we discover that our proper 'seat' is in the place of the servant and our true 'place of honor' is at God's Table where all are equals. When we have this clear in our own minds, then words and deeds are not in opposition.

One way of dying to self that gospel living entails is to be servant of others; this puts title, position, wealth into perspective: all is at the service of the good of others. The new life we might experience by such living takes the form of others respecting us not because of our title or the words we speak but because of the genuine goodness of who we are and what we do. Rather than lay heavy burdens on others, we reach out to help them carry their loads. Rather than putting on symbols of prestige or taking places of honor, we spend ourselves for the least fortunate among us. being a humble servant means we place ourselves at the service of others, recognizing all as our brothers and sisters in Christ. 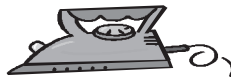

Christian Service

Jesus' opening words in today's Gospel reflect the respect for the law and the institutions of other religions.

Religion is the source of our highest values, role models, love of creation, self-sacrifice, consolation, outrage against injustice, and much more. But religion also generates prejudice, exclusions, crusades, inquisitions, patriarchal dominance, the abuse of children, holy wars, and the conviction that we alone are right. And all religions are guilty of these aberrations, without exception.

Recently, members of the Christian Service Ministry had the opportunity to hear Fr. Shafique Madayat speak about differences in religious beliefs in his home country of Pakistan. Due to poor interpretation of their religious laws, he experienced the unfortunate loss of many innocent lives in his parish. If followers of other religions practiced what they teach and believe, innocent lives would not be lost by violent means.

The great religions are paths to the divine. They have produced saints, mystics, wise women and men, great teachers of the religious path and peacemakers.

In our community I believe there are saints among us, many wise women and men, great teachers of the religious path who lead by example, and those who actively promote peace and justice for our brothers and sisters in Christ.

I witness many in our community who perform act of kindness without wanting recognition or praise, or looking to earn a place of honor or title of authority. I witness servants of Christ who perform generous acts of giving and kindness and compassion. They give of themselves to serve others, because they heed the word of God.

As the gospel readings proclaim, the words we hear are the word of God, and not human words. We live out these words by bringing life to places where there isn't any, giving hope to those that feel helpless, offering food to everyone who is hungry and forgiving others faults.

We can do amazing things when we open ourselves to God and allow Him to use us to do his work.

Make us true servants to all those in need,
Filled with compassion in thought word and deed;
Loving our neighbor whatever the cost,
Feeding the hungry and finding the lost.

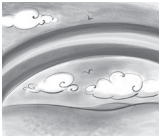
