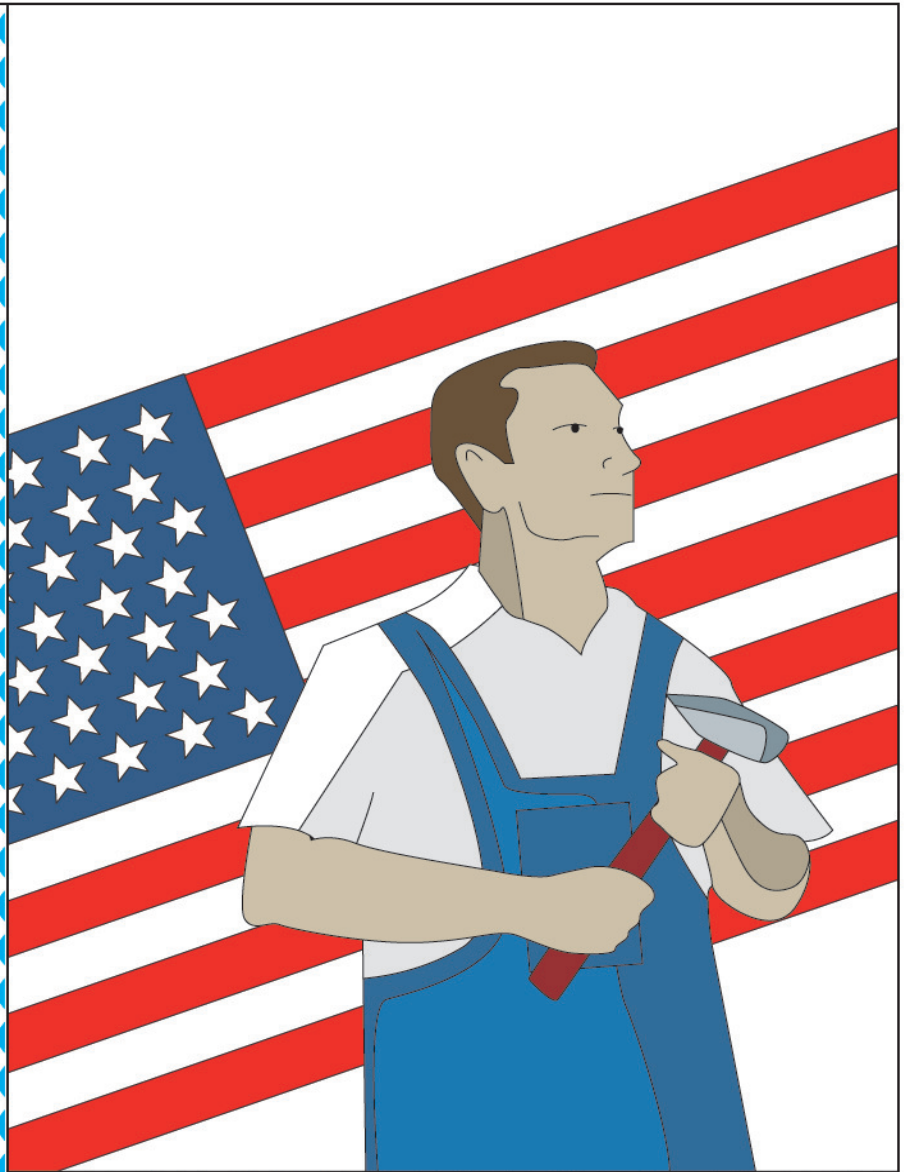

## Fall RE Registration



Religious Education classes will be offered for grades 1 - 6 on Tuesdays and Thursdays starting October 4 thru April 26. This will ensure that the children receive the 30 hours of formation per year recommended by the Archdiocese of Detroit.

## Gathering as a Family

Sometimes Parishioners complain that they are tired of coming into a church in which social conversations are carried on in such a loud voice that they find it difficult to concentrate on their prayers.

As with most things it's a matter of the proper balance. Sometimes we do forget that the purpose of our gathering is to worship God. Sometimes the chatter is carried too far. **However**, we also need to remember that we come to Mass to worship **together**, not as isolated individuals each praying our own set of prayers. There is a time for quiet, individual prayer but that is not the purpose of our Sunday Mass.

The ritual of the Mass is, and always has been, the celebration of a meal and so we gather as the family of God. Therefore we need to remember that whatever we do is done together. It is appropriate that we take time for one another as we gather. We greet one another and we recognize that the church is first and foremost a gathering of God's people. Often enough we find the Lord in the Eucharist that we receive and in the Word that we hear. It is also important to discover God's presence in the people who have gathered in his name.

As we consider our own individual families, we remember that God has given us another family—our parish family. We should be able to think of this family as having a friendly face. It should be a gathering of God's people that is filled with a welcoming spirit. Our expressed concern for one another, our hospitality as we gather, the way we respond and sing and pray as one are all signs that remind us that we are one family of God united in Jesus our Brother. We share our history together in the hearing of God's word in Scripture. We share faith as we sing and pray together. We share together in the meal that is God's gift of God's own Son.

As we begin the new academic year, we focus on our parish families. We are looking forward to having the children back at their catechetical sessions. As catechists we encourage family prayer together, so that the prayer which is experienced in liturgy is not the only prayer that is part of the families' lives.

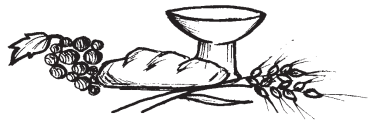
## Worship



Today's readings focus on our relationships with God and each other and on the laws that will best guide us in those relationships. Paul shows us the root of all the other commandments in the one commandment to love, for "love is the fulfillment of the law." In fact, when Jesus is asked about the greatest commandment later in Matthew's account, he gives his top two: love God and love your neighbor. The commandment to have no other gods, and the commandment to respect the name of the Lord and the Sabbath are actually summed up in the commandment to love God. And as St. Paul reminds us, the rest of them are summed up in the commandment to love your neighbor. If we could always love God with our whole being and love others unconditionally, we would never sin. But our love for ourselves often overshadows our love for God and love for our neighbor. Jesus said that you should love your neighbor as yourself. He is not telling us to love ourselves less. Rather, we should bring our love for our neighbor up to the same level as the love for self.

In the First Reading God holds Ezekiel the prophet personally responsible for warning the people about God's teachings. In the Gospel passage, Jesus lays out another requirement of love: he wants people in the community to help each other avoid sin. He instructs the disciples that they must (in charity and respect) confront their fellow Christians when they see sin. So the members of the Christian community bear responsibility for each other, and they also derive strength from their mutual prayer. Christ is especially present with them when they gather for prayer. Love of God and love of neighbor are joined.

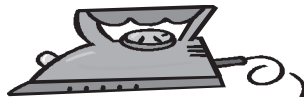

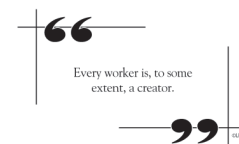
