Family Bible Study

The example Jesus poses in today's Gospel could have been taken directly from family experience. Each of us can recall instances in which family members spoke one thing but then did another. The point of Jesus' story is to show that our actions speak louder than words, even with God.

Jesus could ask us the same question. Do our words indicate our obedience to God? If not our words, do our actions? God desires a full conversion of heart, that our actions (and our words as well) will give evidence of our love for God.

Jesus faulted the religious leaders for not allowing John the Baptist's message of repentance to change their hearts and actions. The word we sometimes use for this change of heart is *conversion*. Jesus wants us to do more than pay lip service to the Gospel; he wants us to be transformed by his word.

Pray that your family will experience a conversion to God and show evidence of this in both actions and words.

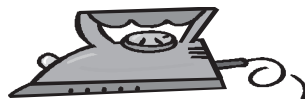

Worship



In our Gospel, the humility of Jesus is contrasted with the pride of the chief priests and elders. Jesus was willing to talk and eat with social outcasts, while they were aloof and self-righteous. When Jesus told the parable of the two sons, it was directed at these same religious leaders. In the parable, the first son said he would not do what his father asked, but in the end he did it. This son represents the tax collectors and prostitutes Jesus spoke of, who failed to keep the law, but in the end believed in Jesus. They lived questionable lives, but eventually turned back to God. The second son said he would do what his father asked, but in the end he did not. This son represents the religious leaders who talk the talk but don't walk the walk. They say they follow the law, but they fail to love their neighbor when they ignore and exclude people. They believed in the prophets, but they rejected Jesus. They refused to believe that Jesus really was the Son of God, and they were too full of pride to change their minds.

Often the greatest barrier to conversion and growth is pride. That's because if we want to grow closer to God and Christ, we have to admit we're not there yet, and that takes humility. But if we follow Christ in humility, we will grow closer to God. (Excerpts taken from At Home With the Word.)

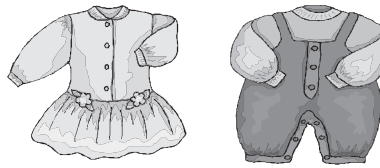

God Bless each of you!

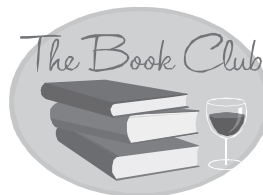


Clothing Needed:

Michigan Peace Team Training Save the Date!

Have you ever found yourself in a tense situation filled with conflict? It can happen at work, while shopping, a township meeting or even in your own family. As Catholics we are reminded through the words and actions of Jesus to find a way to solve our problems using peaceful methods.

On **Saturday, October 15th**, members of the Michigan Peace Team will present nonviolent skills training here in Solanus Hall. Learn about and practice skills for nonviolent peacemaking. Understand the theory and practice of communication skills (e.g. Active Listening "I" messages, etc.). The theory and practice of consensus decision making will also be presented. The team will also raise your awareness to issues of cultural and racial sensitivity.

The day will begin at 9:00 a.m. and conclude at 4:45 p.m. Lunch will be provided. There will be a fee for materials.

This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only.
